At the start of a new month, having consulted our Health and Safety Representatives, we are going to try and 'relax' certain elements in Mass, whilst still trying to maintain a safe environment for everyone attending. Masses on Saturday and Sunday will now only have two stewards. Hopefully by now, parishioners attending Masses will be familiar with the one-system for receiving Holy Communion. At the appropriate time, we invite you to come forward to receive, whilst still observing the floor markings in the aisle, to ensure that social distancing is kept. During Communion at the 11.00am Sunday Mass, there will be a Communion Hymn (printed on the back of this newsletter) which all are invited to join in with......from behind your masks!

Katharine House Cycling Challenge: 'Team St Austin' successfully completed the Cycle Challenge last Sunday – just before the heavens opened! Many thanks to all those who sponsored the team. One member completed the 65 mile route; two members the 40 mile route and the other members the 20 mile route. Canon Michael was the last one to complete the route to fulfil what scripture says, 'the last shall be first and the first last.' If you haven't already paid, there will be volunteers as you leave church today, ready and waiting to collect sponsorships.

This Sunday we begin Prisons Week when we pray for the needs of all those affected by prisons: prisoners and victims, their families, their communities, those working and volunteering in prisons and the criminal justice system.

On Monday we keep the Memorial of Blessed William Howard. He was the grandson of Blessed Philp Howard, Viscount Stafford. Blessed William was accused of complicity in the 'Popish Plot' and after two years imprisonment was beheaded at Tower Hill in 1680. On this day, we pray for the school community at Blessed William Howard School.

This Tuesday is the sixth anniversary since the death of Fr Brian Whatmore. There will be Mass at 12noon on that day, which we will be open to the public.

The Marist Mission have written to thank everyone for their generosity following the recent appeal here. A total of £491 was donation, which when Gift Aid is added, is in effect well over £500.

Brushstrokes are receiving enquires about donations for Afghan refugees. Currently they are asking for donations of warm winter coats (men and women); shoes for (men and women); socks; nappies and rice. As the refugees are yet to be housed, and because Brushstrokes are short of storage space, donations of bedding etc are not needed yet. Live Stream Changes: Please note that Masses on Wednesday, Friday and Saturday (i.e. those open to the public) will no longer be livestreamed. We shall continue to livestream the Monday, Tuesday and Thursday Masses (i.e. those not open to the public) together with the 11.00am Sunday Mass but these will not be uploaded and thus not available for later watching.

Live Streaming of Masses: We use live streaming to enable housebound parishioners and those unable to attend Mass at this time to join in the various liturgies held at St Austin's. From time to time, at the request of the families, the livestream is also used for funerals and weddings. The new position of the camera means that only those with a need to be on the Sanctuary (e.g. the Clergy, Readers and Eucharistic Ministers) are seen, however when it comes to Holy Communion, people are briefly seen (mainly the back of heads) as they approach the priest. Images are made available live over the internet through Facebook page and can be accessed by anyone who wishes to do so.
